Loads of Laundry



Loads of Laundry is a program operated by the Family Resource Center of the Johnson County School System. It is designed to ease the burden of laundry care for struggling families with school age children. Clean clothes and linens can make the world of difference for adults and children.

A free laundry event will be hosted on September 9 at the Lazy Day Laundromat from 5-7 PM. It will also be hosted from 5-7 PM on the first Monday of each month thereafter. The FRC will provide the quarters, detergent, and fabric softener for up to three loads of washing and drying per family.

Callouts will be made if the events are canceled/rescheduled due to inclement weather.
